I would like to first express my sincere congratulations on the establishment of MMCCA. I am honored to be part of the Association and assist in maintaining the service quality of midwives and maternal care industry.

The psychological change gone through by mothers during and after pregnancy is one of the most overlooked issues. According to the Family Health Service from the Department of Health, up to 80% of mothers experience negative emotions during their pregnancy, and 1 in 5 pregnant women experience post-pregnancy depression. While emotional problems can be relieved through frequent communication, improper treatment can lead to psychiatric diseases that may affect both the mother and the baby. Therefore, emotional therapeutic treatment is an important part of maternal care that cannot be disregarded.

Hypnotherapy is a certified healing method that is used to create subconscious change in a patient in the form of new responses, thoughts, attitudes, behaviors or feelings. By incorporating into maternal care treatment, problems such as anxieties, depression and relationship issues can be relieved.

Since hypnotherapy is still at its developing stage as a therapeutic treatment in Hong Kong, it is important to educate the public on the wide range of treatment options available in Hong Kong, especially on its application in maternal care, and provide initiatives in developing the relevant personnel in offering such services so as to continually maintain the professionalism and competitiveness of the health care services in Hong Kong.


